1. **Memorable Moment** Must be written in complete sentences with some detail. Must have an explanation as to why it's memorable: funny, sad, exciting, surprising, etc.
2. **Provocative Thought/Question** What did the reading challenge you to think about or ask about? Use a complete sentence.
3. **Figure of Speech/Imagery** Cite it and identify it.
4. **A Good Line** Reader's choice of what they considered to be a well-written or powerful line.
5. **Connection** Reader must write in complete sentences how the reading reminded them of some prior knowledge they possess (history, science, personal anecdote, etc.).
6. **Summary Sentence** Write one or two *TV Guide*-type sentences to sum up the reading.
7. **Strong Lead Sentence** If you were required to write an essay about this reading, how would you hook your reader? Write that sentence.
8. **Literary Elements** Did the reading contain examples of irony (which type), foreshadowing, dialect, symbolism, rhythm, satire, etc.? Cite and identify.
9. **Setting** Give one or more aspects of setting.
10. **Comments/Review** Write three sentences with your personal take on this reading: its characters, its theme, its level of difficulty, its believability, its likeability, etc.
